Executive Director's Note



On 26th and 27th of August, NIOSH has successfully organised the 22nd Conference and Exhibition on Occupational Safety and Health (COSH 2019) with the theme 'DRIVING OSH EXCELLENCE WITH INTEGRITY FOR THE FUTURE'.

Occupational safety and health agencies and practitioners have been told to always uphold integrity and avoid corrupt practices.

We believe that if someone acts with integrity, he or she will do the right thing even when no one is watching. In the workplace, those who act with integrity will always tell the truth, are accountable, transparent and reliable, and treat co-workers, stakeholders and customers with respect.

According to Business Ethics Institute of Malaysia, fraud elimination is an important aspect of sustainable safety management, especially in managing occupational safety and health, accidents or near misses at the workplace.

Among fraudulent practices that can impact safety outcomes include purchase of low quality personal protection equipment that may increase risks faced by workers and inaccurate records, which can result in wrong assessment of a hazardous situation. Taking shortcuts and circumventing standard operating procedures will create unsafe practices while abuse of power can result in the exploitation of workers to work in dangerous, dirty and demanding work environments.

Conflict of interest and rewarding contracts to less competent vendors might also create safety hazards and expose workers to dangerous environments. It cannot be denied that only integrity, honesty and trustworthiness can help address these problems and prevent corrupt practices. We should not tolerate corruption and allow it to become a culture in our society, especially among occupational safety and health practitioners.

NIOSH also made an important move when it signed the Corruption-Free Pledge with MACC last year and we are among 1,356 agencies and private companies which signed the pledge.

Once again NIOSH has brought the Conference and Exhibition on Occupational Safety and Health (COSH) to the heart of the Kuala Lumpur after it was held in Putrajaya in the last few years.

Our main aim is to give the opportunity to more people to join COSH 2019, not only as the participants but also as exhibitors and visitors. Since last year, COSH was opened not only to the participants but also those from the trade unions, public institutions, education sector and other organisations.

It is in line in with our effort to promote occupational safety and health (OSH) to the masses or “memasyarakatkan” (communitising) OSH. Apart from COSH, NIOSH has also organised various CSR programmes including OSH in School, OSH for Tahfiz, OSH for Media, OSH for the Tourism Industry and a special programme to help empower those from the B40 group.

Apart from the customary seminar and presentation of working papers, COSH 2019 exhibition is being held in a livelier atmosphere where various activities are being organised to attract the crowd. Most of them are related to OSH and will definitely benefit the public

For this year, we manage to attract more than 1,000 participants while some 80 companies are involved in the exhibition, showcasing their products and services.

DRIVING OSH EXCELLENCE WITH INTEGRITY FOR THE FUTURE

The theme for this year focuses on integrity and it was chosen as we believe that if someone acts with integrity, he or she will do the right thing even when no one is watching.

Trust, honour, and honesty are key elements to the concept of integrity. In the workplace, those who act with integrity will always tell the truth, are accountable and reliable, and treat co-workers, stakeholders and customers with respect.

Civil servants, employees of government-linked companies (GLCs) and those from the corporate sector should always hold fast to the high level of integrity and avoid corrupt practices. Integrity must be instilled when they join an organisation so that and it will become part of their identity.

The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) statistics also shows that civil servants made up 46.3 per cent of 4,860 persons arrested for graft offences from 2014 until June this year.

MACC chief commissioner Latheefa Koya was quoted saying that most of the offences were committed by staff in the procurement sector and a survey compiled by MACC also revealed that 22.1 per cent respondents in the public sector said they were willing to accept bribes if they were in a position of power.



According to the Business Ethics Institute of Malaysia (BEIM), fraud elimination is an important aspect of sustainable safety management, especially in managing near misses and in enhancing the positive rationalisation of power among employers and their employees.

Among fraudulent practices which could impact safety outcomes include the purchase of low quality personal protection equipment (PPE), which could increase the risk faced by workers, and inaccurate records which could result in wrong assessment of a hazardous situation.

Taking short cuts and circumventing standard operating procedure (SOP) will create unsafe practices while abuse of power can result in the exploitation of workers to work in dangerous, dirty and demanding work environment.

At the same time, conflict of interest and rewarding contracts to less-competent vendors might also create safety hazards and expose workers to dangerous environment.

It cannot be denied that only integrity, honesty and trustworthiness can help stop a person from involving in corruption.

We should not tolerate corruption and allow it to become a culture in our society, especially among OSH practitioners.

In the fight against corruption, the elements of integrity, governance process and ethical behaviours should be integrated into existing safety syllabus.

We should educate OSH practitioners to have integrity and loathe corruption in the same way they are taught to hate drugs.

We have to teach them moral values so that when they are at the workplace, they would realise the importance of not getting involved in corruption.

While efforts by the MACC to fight corruption are much welcomed, it is very obvious that the fight should also begin at all workplaces.

NIOSH has also made an important move when it signed the Corruption-Free Pledge (IBR) with MACC last year. We are among 1,356 agencies and private companies which have signed to IBR last year.

Corruption in Malaysia is at a worrying level and there is no point in toning things down when there are facts to show that it is increasing.

A study conducted by MACC on 1,000 university students found that 16 per cent were willing to accept a bribe and 18.5 per cent would accept a bribe if they did not have to face any action.

Another survey on Students' Perception of Corruption carried out by the Integrity Institute of Malaysia (IIM) reveals that one in every three local university students thinks that receiving a present in the form of money, goods or service in return for services rendered is not corruption.

The survey shows that 28.1% of the respondents also thought that it was not an offence for them to take company-owned properties or items, including pen drives, printer ink or papers for personal use.

At the same time, 37.3% of the respondents assumed that submitting claims for fully-sponsored outstation duties was not wrong.

Corruption in all forms must never be tolerated as it impoverishes the country, causes hardship to the people and economy to decline. If it involves OSH practitioners and agencies, it may result in accidents that could cause injury or death.

We cannot be unconcerned and complacent about corruption because it attacks not only the economic and social fabric of society but also the moral foundations of order.

Efforts should be continuously made to instil integrity and ethical values because people of high integrity are not likely to commit corrupt practices in any circumstances.

APOSHO 35

It is our pleasure to inform YB Minister and everyone today that the 35th Asia-Pacific Occupational Safety and Health Organisation (APOSHO 35) conference and annual general meeting will be held concurrently with COSH 2020 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre next year (2020).

The programme will be jointly organised by the three APOSHO members from Malaysia namely the Malaysian Society for Occupational Safety and Health (MSOSH), National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) and Malaysian Occupational Safety and Health Practitioners' Association (MOSHHA).

We are able to bring APOSHO 35 to Kuala Lumpur due to the strong cooperation, joint efforts and influence of the three organisations.

Our strong cooperation has also helped NIOSH Malaysia to be accepted as a full member of APOSHO in Bangkok in July 2014.

APOSHO is an international body comprising non-profit professional organisations devoted to the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases. Currently, it has 27 full, two associate, eight affiliate and 20 honorary members from a total of 19 countries or districts.



All three full members of APOSHO from Malaysia will join APOSHO 34 in Guiyang, China in September this year and I will also present a paper on mental health issues at workplace at the event.

It is our hope that both events next year – APOSHO 35 and COSH 2020 – will attract more local and international participants to share their knowledge and expertise in OSH and the challenges ahead.

EXCHANGE OF MOU & MOA

At this special event, NIOSH will also exchange Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with Korea Occupational Safety and Health Agency (KOSHA), Universiti Kuala Lumpur (UniKL) and Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM)

NIOSH and KOSHA will mutually enhance the status of OSH in Malaysia and Korea while promoting safety and health among workers in both countries.

Under the MoA with UniKL, both parties have agreed to conduct awareness and competency training programs, consultation and research and development on Occupational Safety and Health.

As for the collaboration with UiTM, NIOSH will assist in the development of the curriculum for the Diploma in Industrial Hygiene and Safety Technology, Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Industrial Hygiene Technology

Among others, both parties have also agreed to exchange materials and staff and students to help enhance professionalism and providing experience in the relevant fields.

Blast Management Plan (BMP) For Construction Project Sites

Introduction

A blast management plan (BMP) is a risk control plan used in explosive blasting. It aims to ensure blasts do not harm people in the area and limit damage to the environment. A BMP is prepared by the shotfirer before every blast and after consulting those involved in the blast. A BMP is the recommended method for planning safe use of explosives.

OSH Legal Requirements

Under FMA BOWEC (Safety) Regulations 1986, Part XI (Demolition) & XV (Blasting and Use of Explosives) and OSH Act 1994 Sect 15, 17, 18, 20, 21 24 & 25 which are relevant to the blasting activities and it is still the jurisdiction of DOSH to enforce the above laws.

Purpose of Blast Management Plan

The purpose of blast management plan, are to:

- explain the objectives of the blast.
- identify hazards and risks, including control and/or mitigation.
- identify site-specific requirements.
- introduce the blast as part of the overall task in a planned manner.
- initiation and in the event of a misfire.
- comply with the approval/contract specifications.
- ensure safety of the public, site personnel and surrounding properties.
- implement a review process to ensure that the objectives are met.



Other Considerations

A statement is required about what the blast is going to achieve. Is it for demolition, extraction of ore, civil works or other work? The type of work will indicate the key safety and environment risks that will need to be considered. Points to consider include:

- type of explosives and the method used to fire them.
- whether the blast is in a built-up area or a remote location.
- date and time of the blast.
- number of people and equipment involved.

An exclusion zone should be established at a distance from and surrounding of any construction project sites when using explosives. The zone needs to be designed and managed as part of the overall approach to the project sites. People outside the exclusion zone should be safe from the rock blasting work. Everyone, with the possible exception of the shotfirer, should be outside the exclusion zone at the time of the blast. If the shotfirer needs to remain within the zone, he or she should be in a safe position.

Seminar Keselamatan Dan Kesihatan Psikologi Pekerja



Pada 7-8 Ogos 2019, telah berlangsung majlis perasmian seminar Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Psikologi Pekerja. Seminar Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Psikologi Pekerja 2019 anjuran bersama NIOSH dan Jabatan Perkhidmatan Awam (JPA) dirasmikan oleh YBhg. Tan Sri Datuk Seri Lee Lam Thye, Pengerusi NIOSH. Seminar itu telah diadakan di Dewan Akasia, Agensi Antidadah Kebangsaan, Kajang Selangor.

Objektif utama seminar tersebut diadakan adalah bagi memberi kefahaman dan kesedaran dalam bidang Keselamatan dan Kesihatan seperti Perundangan, Sistem Pengurusan KKP, Jawatankuasa KKP, Polisi dan perkara berkaitan.

Program tersebut akan dibangunkan secara berperingkat dengan fasa pertama memberi fokus terhadap usaha meningkatkan kesedaran tentang kesihatan mental dan menghapuskan stigma kesihatan mental di tempat kerja. Fasa berikutnya akan memberikan fokus terhadap pengurusan masalah kesihatan mental di tempat kerja melalui penglibatan majikan dan pekerja.

NIOSH turut merancang untuk membangunkan modul 'Psychological First Aid' (Pertolongan Cemas Psikologi) bagi membantu majikan dan pekerja memberikan bantuan awal kepada mereka yang berhadapan dengan masalah mental di tempat kerja. Ia merupakan antara modul yang telah dirancang untuk disampaikan kepada industri. Seminar 2 hari itu dihadiri oleh hampir 400 peserta dari pelbagai agensi kerajaan dan ahli NIOSH.



Aktiviti Kawad Kecemasan Serta Pengungsian Bangunan Utama, NIOSH



Pada 14 Ogos 2019 , NIOSH telah menjalankan Kawad Kecemasan Tumpahan Bahan Kimia (Asid Nitrik) di Makmal CHL. Seramai 63 orang telah terlibat dalam akitiviti tersebut. 20 orang daripadanya adalah peserta kursus manakala selebihnya adalah kakitangan NIOSH.

Aktiviti menyelamatkan dilakukan keatas 2 orang mangsa yang lemas akibat terhidu bahan kimia di dalam Makmal CHL. Pasukan NEFT, Pasukan Bomba & Penyelamat Bandar Baru Bangi dan Unit HAZMAT Shah Alam telah terlibat dalam menyelamatkan mangsa yang terperangkap di dalam makmal.

Pelancaran Program Latihan Pasport Keselamatan Media (MSP)

Pada 15 Ogos 2019, Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Negara (NIOSH) melancarkan program latihan Pasport Keselamatan Media (MSP) yang merupakan program pertama seumpamanya di Malaysia.

Pengerusi NIOSH Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye telah melancarkan program latihan MSP di Pusat Konvensyen Kuala Lumpur. Program ini juga merupakan modul e-pembelajaran "hibrid" yang pertama di mana para peserta boleh belajar secara dalam talian sebelum mereka menghadiri kelas dan mengambil peperiksaan untuk mendapatkan pasport keselamatan.

NIOSH turut mengambil kira semua masalah yang dihadapi oleh organisasi media dan dengan itu bersedia untuk menganjurkan kelas-kelas di premis media jika mereka mempunyai jumlah minimum peserta yang diperlukan. Modul ini juga sangat unik kerana ia boleh dipertingkatkan pada bila-bila masa berdasarkan maklumbalas terbaharu daripada organisasi media dan pihak berkepentingan lain.

Turut hadir pengerusi Astro Malaysia Holdings Bhd Tun Zaki Tun Azmi, pengerusi Bernama Datuk Seri Azman Ujang, pengerusi Institut Akhbar Malaysia Datuk Dr. Chamil Wariya, Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif Akademi Keselamatan dan Penjagaan Kecemasan (ASEC) Wong Wee Zhee dan Khairunnizam Mustapa yang merupakan pengurus besar Bahagian Perundingan, Penyelidikan dan Pembangunan NIOSH.

Pengerusi NIOSH, Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye berharap organisasi media dan institusi berkaitan dapat tampil ke hadapan untuk berkongsi maklumbalas mereka supaya NIOSH dapat meningkatkan modul latihan MSP agar dapat memberi manfaat kepada pengamal media terutamanya yang berada di lapangan. NIOSH turut mendapat kerjasama dan sokongan pelbagai pihak terutamanya MPI dan organisasi media.

Program pasport keselamatan merupakan kursus induksi mengenai keselamatan dan kesihatan pekerjaan (KKP) dan ia dilaksanakan secara meluas dalam pelbagai industri termasuk minyak dan gas, telekomunikasi, penjaan dan pembekalan tenaga serta operasi lebuhraya.

Di majlis tersebut, Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye turut menyampaikan anugerah khas kepada Pengerusi Astro Malaysia, Tun Datuk Seri Zaki Tun Azmi untuk mengiktiraf inisiatif syarikat itu yang menjadi organisasi penyiaran pertama yang melaksanakan program latihan pasport keselamatan. Terdahulu, lebih daripada 100 pengamal media dan mereka dari organisasi berkaitan menyertai program perintis MSP di KLCC.

Persidangan Dan Pameran bagi Keselamatan Dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Kali Ke-22 (COSH 2019)

Pada 26-27 Ogos 2019 NIOSH telah menganjurkan Persidangan dan Pameran Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan 2019 (COSH 2019) kali ke-22 di Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC). Bertemakan konsep "Driving OSH Excellence with Integrity for the Future", persidangan ini telah berlangsung dengan jayanya atas sokongan daripada lebih 1,000 penggiat OSH. Persidangan dua hari itu menjadi platform utama penggiat-penggiat OSH dalam mendalami cabaran dan isu-isu utama bidang itu.

Perasmian persidangan telah disempurnakan oleh Menteri Sumber Manusia M Kula Segaran pada hari pertama persidangan tersebut. Turut hadir ialah Pengerusi Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Negara (NIOSH), Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye.

Persidangan dan Pameran Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan kali ke-22 (COSH 2019) ini merupakan forum yang terbaik kepada para majikan dan pekerja untuk mengetahui maklumat serta perkembangan terkini di dalam bidang Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan (KKP) serta dapat menghasilkan cetusan idea dan pendekatan yang berguna dalam membantu para majikan dan pekerja secara amnya dan kerajaan khususnya untuk melaksanakan usaha penambahbaikan berterusan ke tahap yang lebih baik.

Sebanyak 18 persidangan diadakan secara serentak pada hari kedua, dengan 18 pakar tempatan dan antarabangsa dari pelbagai bidang. COSH 2019 kali yang ke 22 ini telah berjaya menarik lebih daripada 1,000 peserta manakala kira-kira 57 syarikat terlibat dalam pameran itu, yang mempamerkan produk dan perkhidmatan mereka. Lebih dari 3,000 pelawat juga turut memeriahkan COSH dengan melawat pameran OSH yang diadakan serentak dengan acara dua hari itu. Ia tidak mungkin berjalan dengan lancar tanpa sokongan daripada semua peserta, tempatan dan antarabangsa. Fakta bahawa COSH menarik lebih ramai peserta bermakna kesedaran mengenai OSH di negara ini telah bertambah baik sejak beberapa tahun lalu dan yakin bahawa bersama-sama kita dapat berusaha ke arah Malaysia yang lebih selamat dan sihat.
