United by Unique: Reducing Cancer Risk and Understanding NCSM's Role

Cancer. Just mentioning it can be terrifying. Many people dread this illness, however few really know what it is. Simply put, cancer results from uncontrollably growing cells in the body creating tumors or spreading to other areas of the body. Changes in our genes, some of which we inherit from and others of which our environment and lifestyle shape, cause this abnormal development. Although cancer can strike any part of the body, many cases can be avoided or found early, giving people more chances at life.

Two primary forms of tumors that could develop in the body are benign and malignant tumors. Because they affect surrounding tissues and can spread to other places, malignant tumors are deadly and complicate treatment. Conversely, benign tumors are less destructive since they remain in one location and do not spread. Early diagnosis is essential regardless of the kind to enhance treatment results and quality of life.

Though there is no one cause of cancer, some risk factors increase one's chance of getting it. Among these elements, age and genes are beyond our control. Our cells run more danger of mutations as we age, which might cause cancer. Likewise, some people inherit genetic changes that increase their likelihood of acquiring particular kinds of cancer. Although some elements cannot be changed, many dangers are connected to our daily activities and can be adjusted to lower the cancer risk.

Of the most important changeable risk factors is smoking. Still the single most avoidable cause of cancer globally, it accounts for about 22% of cancer deaths. There are at least 69 recognized carcinogens among the roughly 7,000 compounds in cigarette smoke. The World Health Organization (WHO) reports that smoking is connected to at least 15 distinct kinds of cancer, including bladder, throat and lung cancer. Unbelievably, smokers have 15 to 30 times higher risk of lung cancer than non-smokers. The positive news is, lung function can begin to improve just a few months after stopping, quitting smoking at any age.

Development of cancer also depends critically on an improper diet and obesity. The World Cancer Research Fund (WCRF) estimates that a good lifestyle, including a balanced diet, may help to prevent between 30 and 50 percent of cancer cases. High consumption of processed foods, too much red meat and lots of sugar all help to cause weight gain,

inflammation, and higher cancer risk. Studies reveal that at least 13 kinds of cancer, including breast, colon and pancreatic cancer, are connected to fat. Keeping a good weight on a nutrient-dense diet heavy in fruits, vegetables and whole grains helps guard against these potential dangers.

Another main risk factor for cancer is alcohol use. Though studies reveal otherwise, many people think moderate drinking is safe. The WHO classifies alcohol as a Group 1 carcinogen, so it is confirmed to cause human cancer. It relates to colon, breast, liver and oral cancers. With alcohol-related malignancies accounting for more than 740,000 new cases each worldwide, shockingly even light to moderate drinking raises cancer risk. The truth is that there is no safe alcohol level.

Another usually disregarded risk factor is physical inactivity. According to the American Cancer Society, inadequate physical activity is blamed for roughly one in ten cancer cases reported worldwide. An inactive lifestyle raises a chance of several diseases, especially colon and breast cancer. Just 150 minutes a week of moderate exercise, such as dance, cycling, or brisk walking, can dramatically cut cancer risk. Movement helps regulate hormones, strengthen the immune system and reduce inflammation, all of which contribute to cancer prevention.

Since cancer sometimes starts silently, early warning symptoms are important. The National Cancer Society of Malaysia (NCSM) stresses the need of knowing signs like odd tumors, unexpected weight loss, constant tiredness and changes of skin. Should any peculiar symptoms persist, it is always advisable to consult a doctor since early identification improves the results of treatment.

Many cancers do not exhibit signs until they have progressed, hence routine screenings are absolutely vital. Tests that allow early cancer detection makes treatment more successful. Among common tests include colonoscopies for colorectal cancer, Pap smears for cervical cancer and mammograms for breast cancer. Studies reveal that early detection of cancer greatly increases survival rates and increases patients' likelihood of having healthy lives.

For people and families impacted by cancer, the National Cancer Society Malaysia (NCSM) has been a ray of hope from its founding in 1966. The company

is dedicated to enlightening, stopping, and helping individuals affected by the illness. They provide a wide variety of services, including reasonably priced cancer tests in order to ensure early discovery, community outreach initiatives to bring health education and screenings to underprivileged regions and patient support programs with financial assistance and treatment direction. NCSM also offers psychosocial support to enable patients and their families to negotiate the psychological and emotional demands of a cancer diagnosis. Services guaranteeing patients receive comprehensive treatment include nutritional consulting, play therapy and psychotherapy.

The battle against cancer is a group effort involving everyone, not only among medical experts. Taking care of our health, making wise decisions, and motivating others to follow suit will help to avoid cancer in turn. Simple lifestyle choices such as stopping smoking, eating better, cutting alcohol intake, keeping active, and scheduling regular visits can significantly lower cancer risk.

As a whole, we can spread awareness, help each other, and start early for a better future. Although cancer is a frightening illness, we can save lives and lower its load in our communities by means of early detection, prevention, and education. ▼

Dalam usaha memperkuat identiti organisasi serta memastikan keselarasan dengan visi, misi dan hala tuju masa depan, NIOSH telah melaksanakan langkah transformasi dengan memperkuat fungsi Pejabat Negeri serta Bahagian di Ibu Pejabat.
